

**LOUISIANA ASSOCIATION OF THE DEAF
BOARD OF DIRECTOR MEETING**

Meeting: The LAD Board of Director met at the La. School for the Deaf in the North Campus Student Center, Saturday, September 25, 1982 at 9:30 a.m. with all Board of Directors present.

Officer: President Anthony Mowad stated that the meeting would be short therefore the minutes of the last meeting would be read at the next Board meeting.

Dr. Harvey Jay Corson, Supt. of the School for the Deaf, was introduced. Dr. Corson welcomed all to the Homecoming Program. He gave a brief history of homecoming games and account of buildings in Phase II part B to be started on December 8, 1982. All were invited to the groundbreaking ceremonies.

Joe Broussard brought up the question on establishment of affiliated chapters of the L.A.D. President Mowad stated that there was no action on it this year. Joe Broussard suggested that we take action on it in 1983.

President Mowad appointed Vice-President Medford Magill and Joe Broussard as co-chairmen of a workshop for ideas on establishing affiliated chapter of the LAD. Joe Broussard announced that the tentative place for the workshop would be Opelousas — dated to be announced before Christmas.

Committee Report: Ms. Connie Greenlee, chairlady of the Miss LAD Pageant reported that the winner as Miss LAD would compete at the NAD convention in Baltimore, Md. on July 8, 1983.

Vice President Report: M. Magill reported that the NAD convention passed a motion effective in 1984 requiring \$4.00 per LAD member be paid to the NAD.

Chairman Delvin Fontenot reported on the 1983 LAD convention.

Vice President Magill reported that the Homecoming Dance will be sponsored by B.R. Association of the Deaf.

Joe Broussard brought up the matter of a \$500.00 donation to Dr. Smith, former Ass't Supt. of State of Education because the LAD secretary had no record of action on this. Mr. Dave Meyers explained Dr. Smith's legal situation and he polled the Board of Directors who agreed to withdraw \$500.00 from the treasury for Dr. Smith's attorney fees.

Joe Broussard (D. Fontenot) moved that the secretary be reimbursed \$19.50 in travel expenses for moving LAD files from former secretary John Henderson's home in New Orleans to Baton Rouge. Carried.

The brief case used by Dave Meyers was worn out. President Mowad directed Secretary Sheffield to purchase a new one and also one to Treasurer Max Ray. President Mowad also directed that the association's typewriter be moved to the secretary's home and the teletypewriter remain with Ms. Linda Annala until further notice. No one could account for the whereabouts of the association's Gestehner mimeograph machine. Secretary Sheffield was directed to ask Lucius Walker to see if Lucius could help track it down.

Harvey Gremiloin suggested that the LAD make a resolution that Dr. Corson should remain as Supt. of the LSD until the completion of Phase II construction before applying for the position as President of Gallaudet College. Delvin Fontenot posed this as a motion. Seconded by Joe Sarpy, motion carried.

Report on La. Commission for the Deaf: Dave Meyers, acting Executive Chairman reported that L.C.D. had \$34,600 and that there was a need for more interpreter.

Cleve Cormier, former Chairman of 1982 LAD convention, raised the question of the unpaid bill of \$85.00 for the advertisement due to the Lafayette Athletic Association of the Deaf. President Mowad directed that it be paid.

The meeting adjourned at 11:40 a.m.
